Environmental sustainability has moved centre stage this year and our girls have been pioneers in this area.

Project Zero is a pupil-led initiative to reduce the impact of the school's impact on the environment. A Carbon Trust survey, a new recycling system, and the replacement of single-use plastic in *Oakwood*, have all been made possible thanks to the generosity of parents and alumnae, but there is still so much more to do.

Carbon offsetting, plastic recycling, composting of organic waste, replacement of paper towels and conversion to LED lighting all require significant investment beyond our everyday budget.


