# Our masterplan



Built on our values

Back in 2018, we outlined our masterplan as we looked towards our 150th Anniversary in 2026–27. As we reach the halfway point, I am inspired to reflect on what has already been achieved and how wholeheartedly our community has invested in our vision and helped us.

In 2018, our community donated £250,000 to our projects; this year, you have donated over £1.3 million. The Waterlow Hall was an echoing breeze block building; it is now a state-of-the-art, award-winning concert hall and theatre. Four years ago, we were able to help 26 pupils with their fees; this September, more than 40 students are receiving means-tested support. In 2020 and 2021, we were able to reduce our carbon footprint and offset our emissions to achieve UN carbon neutral accreditation. Last year, 37 state schools joined our Debate Hub events and we welcomed over 50 external speakers to inspire our pupils – all this is thanks to your support.

One of our community projects over the last 12 months has been to crystallise our vision for the school's 150th birthday. The vision is supported by five new school values which we will launch this year: **Aspiration, Creativity, Kindness, Courage** and **Commitment**. They are values which lie at the very heart of our philanthropic initiatives.

We aspire to be a diverse and inclusive school, opening our doors to all, regardless of background or means, and we hope to deliver the best possible facilities to support a dynamic learning environment for pupils and our outstanding teachers.

We have discovered creative ways to extend our partnerships with other schools

and organisations, and we are building innovative programmes alongside them like the Debate Hub initiative and the Teacher Exchange Project.

Our bursary programme is founded on kindness: the welcoming and considerate nature of our pupils and the kindness and generosity of our donors. Last year, you pledged more than a million pounds to support bursaries. Thank you.

We have been courageous about offering more funded places this year than ever before: 1 in 8 of our Year 7 cohort have fully funded places; and we have opened our doors to displaced pupils from Ukraine. We have trusted in your generosity in the future to continue to support these places as the pupils move through the school.

We are committed to sustaining and building our bursary support and we hope to fund at least 10 more new 100% bursaries in September 2023 – our aim is to have doubled our support by 2026. Similarly, we are committed to reducing our carbon footprint and achieving net carbon zero in the long term.

As we celebrate what has been achieved in the last year and say thank you, we also want to give you a clear view of our next priorities which are outlined in this booklet. As we embark on the second half of our *Towards 150* journey, I do hope that we can count on your support.

### HIGHLIGHTS OF THE OPENING DOORS CAMPAIGN

- At the *Towards 150* concert, Mrs Bingham outlined our fundraising goals and announced a gift of a full seven-year bursary as we embarked on our Annual Campaign.
- The whole community came together at the Opening Doors Dinner where over £250,000 was raised and pledged towards the bursary programme.
- Four alumnae year groups launched their own *Class of bursary* appeals.
- 76 people joined the *1876 Society* by pledging to donate £1,876 or more each year to our bursary funds.
- The Black Heart Foundation matched gifts from our leaving parents. They are now supporting a Sixth Form pupil through the *Class of 2022* bursary.
- We were honoured to receive a legacy from the late Jean Middlemiss (Hon Alumnae) to support our bursary funds.

## *For the second year running, we achieved UN Carbon Neutral certification*

#### HIGHLIGHTS OF OUR PROJECT ZERO

- South Hampstead was featured as a case study for sustainability at COP26 and the school was represented by a Lower Sixth pupil at the conference.
- Eco reps undertook an energy audit to assess our environmental impact, and we conducted our second annual carbon footprint survey funded through Project Zero donations.

## *Long lasting & mutually-enriching partnerships*

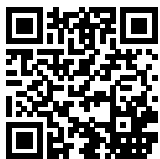

### STAFF AND STUDENT FUNDRAISING

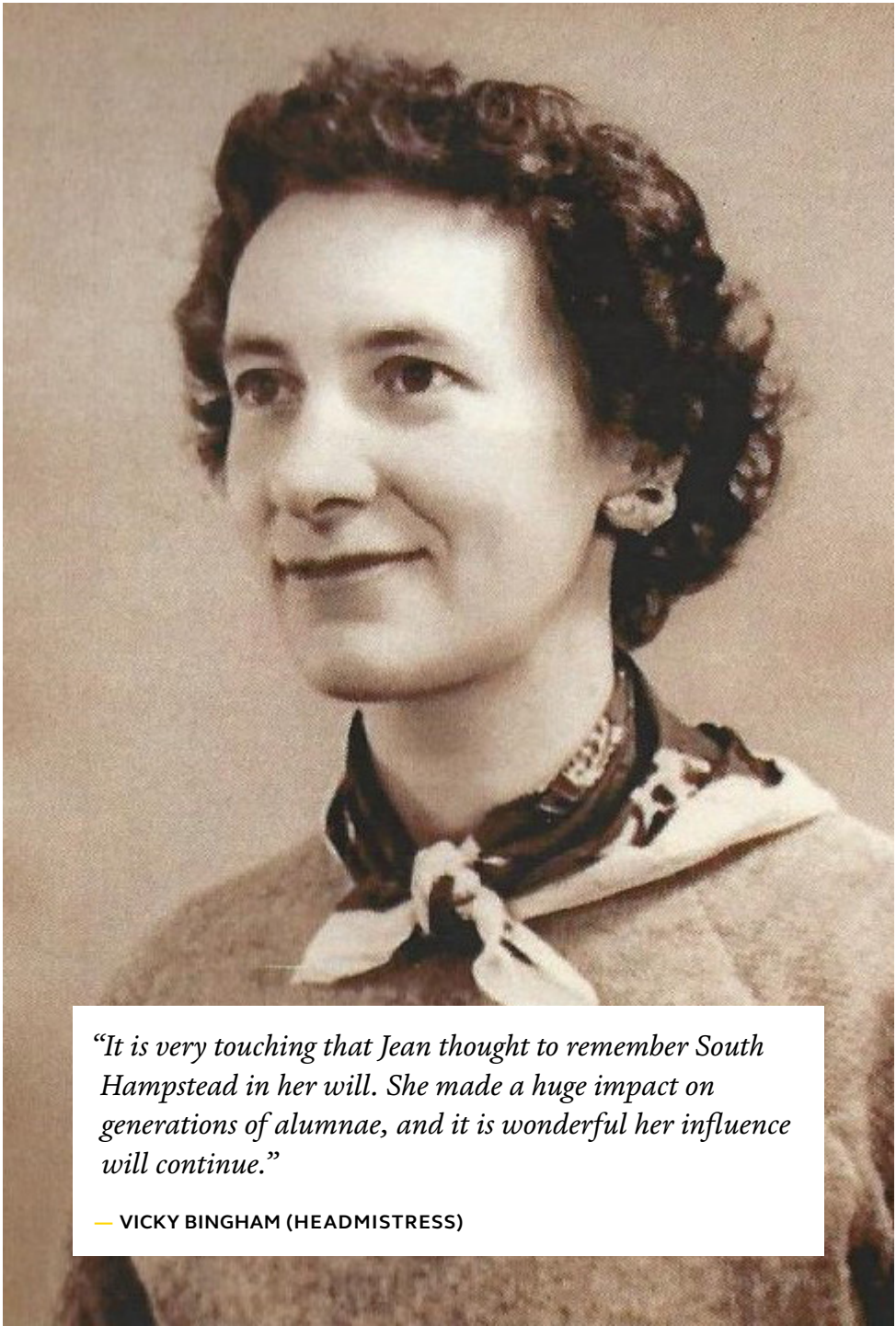

You can get involved by volunteering, organising events, offering careers guidance and supporting pupil initiatives or by making a donation.

As a member of the GDST, South Hampstead is covered by the registered charity status (no. 306983). There are significant financial advantages if you choose to make a donation to one of our funds.

- If you are a UK taxpayer we can claim Gift Aid which will boost your donation by 25p for every £1 you donate. Please sign the Gift Aid declaration when you make your donation.
- If you are a higher-rate taxpayer, you will also be eligible to claim back tax paid on your gift from the Inland Revenue.
- If you choose to donate shares or property, you can save 40% capital gains tax and deduct the full value of the shares or property from your income for tax purposes.
- Legacies left in your will are free from inheritance tax.

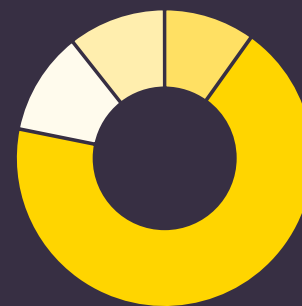
